



Pearls in Peril EU LIFE Project:

River South Esk in-stream restoration

- Temporary disruption from 6th July for 4 to 5 weeks

The River South Esk is designated as a Special Area of Conservation (SAC) with internationally important populations of freshwater pearl mussel and Atlantic salmon. It is presently assessed as being in 'unfavourable' condition by Scottish Natural Heritage (SNH). 'Pearls in Peril' (PiP), a UK-wide project to safeguard the future of the freshwater pearl mussel, is funding restoration works which have positive effects with regards to restoring natural process and the habitat of freshwater pearl mussels and salmonids.

Works will commence on Monday 6th July for 4 to 5 weeks.
There may be some disruption to footpaths and signposts for alternative paths will be in place.

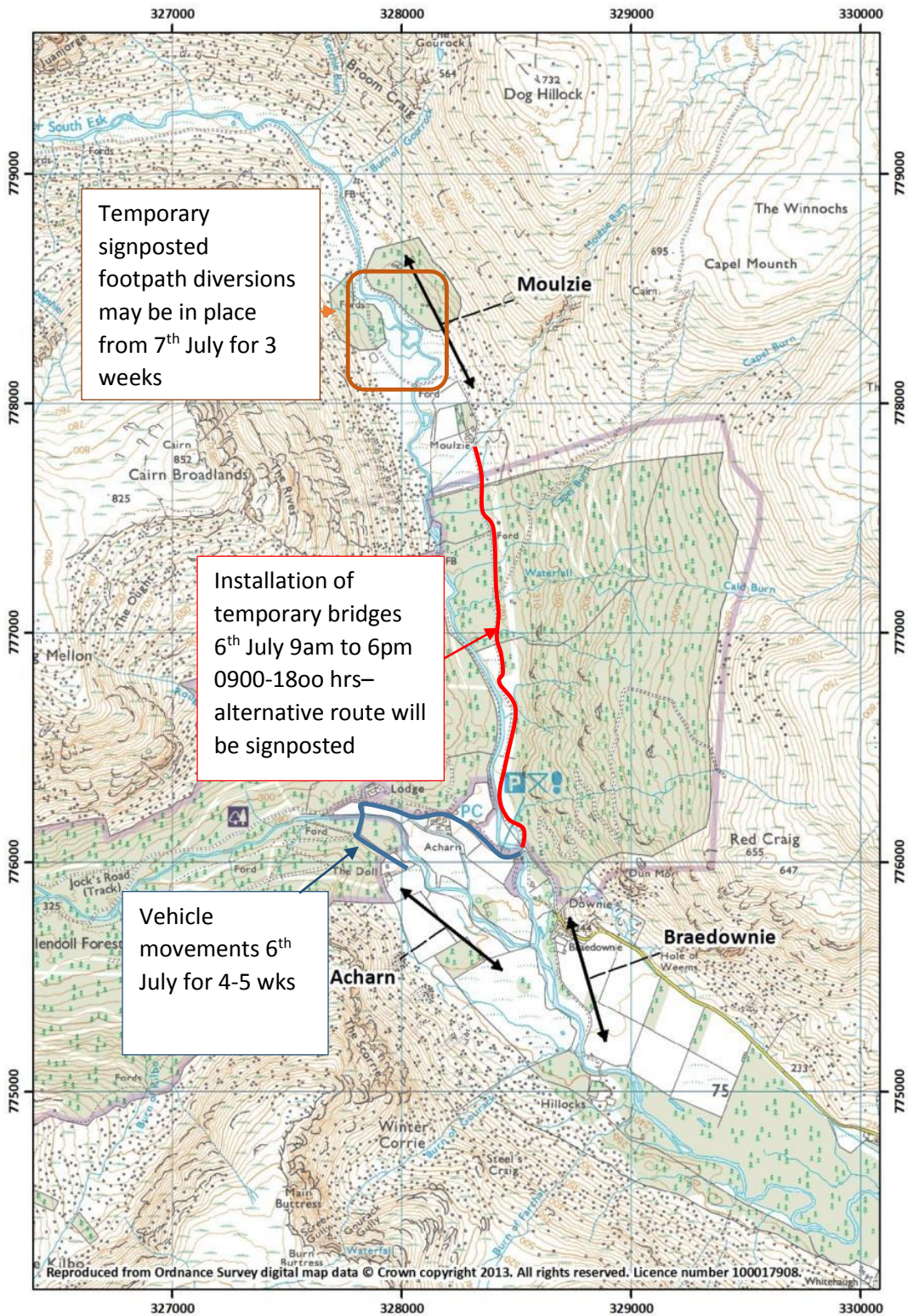
